Cramond, Barnton and Cammo Community Council Meeting Minutes

1. Introductory Business:

Members & Guests Present: Stuart Brown, Peter Scott, Nicola Gray, Gavin Duncan (Engagement Officer), Councillor Louise Young, and Aaron Mckeen (Edinburgh Airport Sustainability Engagement Manager)

Welcome and Apologies: Vice Chair, Grant McCulloch brought the meeting to order, welcomed attendees, and noted that the meeting was being recorded. Apologies were accepted on behalf of the Chair.

Minutes of the Last Meeting: The minutes of the previous meeting, held on the 21st of May, were proposed, seconded and formally approved without any objections.

Matters Arising and Police Report: No Police report was provided and no representatives were in attendance. This was noted with disappointment. A reported incident in the area had been raised previously, but no updates were available. It was agreed that the proposed flier regarding night flights would be paid for with our current funds. There was a discussion about various aspects of Edinburgh Airports functioning.

2. Cramond Campus Development: The first pre-application consultation for the revised proposals is scheduled for Wednesday, June 24th June, from 3:00 to 8:00 pm at the Kirk Halls. Members of the public were urged to attend and provide their feedback to the Community Council. Peter Scott and Andrew Duncan will prepare draft observations based on this exhibition. These will be circulated to members and published online before being sent to the developers and City planners. Ongoing concerns were mentioned regarding the extent of open space, sports facilities and financial viability of refurbishing the proposed artificial pitch and other open space in the future.

3. Barnton Connections: The project scope is under review following strong requests during the public consultation to include additional areas, notably an extension to the Primary School. Officers are investigating whether funding is available to incorporate these requests and further updates are expected at the next meeting.

4. Infrastructure and Services:

Davidsons Mains Roundabout: The roadworks have suffered significant delays and will not finish on schedule. The Roundabout is expected to partially re-open on Saturday with three-way traffic lights, allowing the 47 bus to resume its normal route and ending the temporary shuttle bus service. The City Council intends to question the terms of the contract and investigate if the delays will result in additional costs, noting the contractor failed to provide the necessary capacity. The free shuttle bus was highly praised for its frequency and ability to accommodate school children.

Silverknowes Road North: Re-opening works have commenced.

Turnhouse Road Bus Gate: Results of a traffic survey regarding the bus gate restrictions are awaited. These are causing issues for residents of nearby developments.

Salvesen Steps: Work has been delayed due to inaccurate topographical surveys, which have necessitated a redesign of the concrete uprights, The Steps are expected to open in early July.

Library: A temporary library facility (replacing the closed Blackhall Library) is now open at Davidsons Mains Primary School.

Finally a motion was proposed by Ian Williamson the previous secretary) that CBCCC engage with CEC to draw attention to the substantial increase in commuter traffic, and for measures to be brought in to mitigate this. It was agreed this would be discussed at our next meeting.
